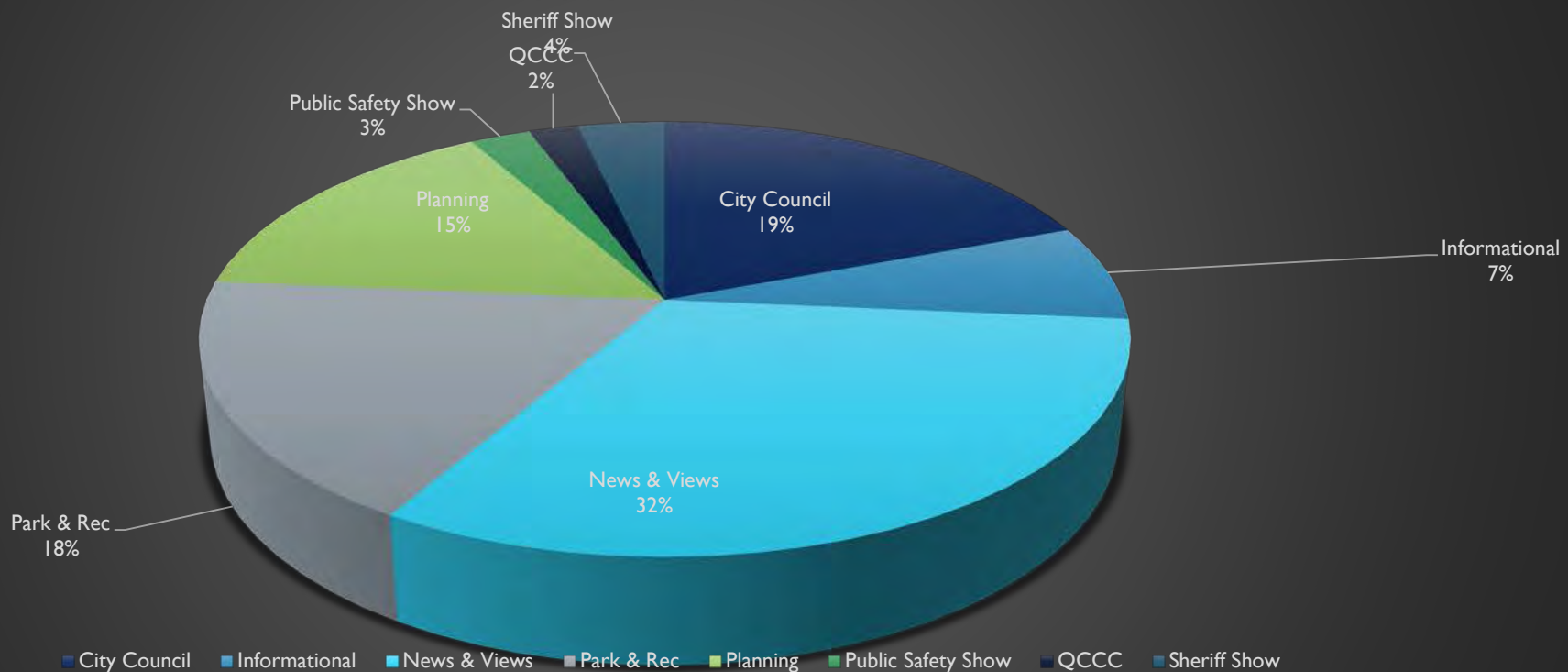

2015 TOTAL RUNS FOR ANDOVER MEETINGS

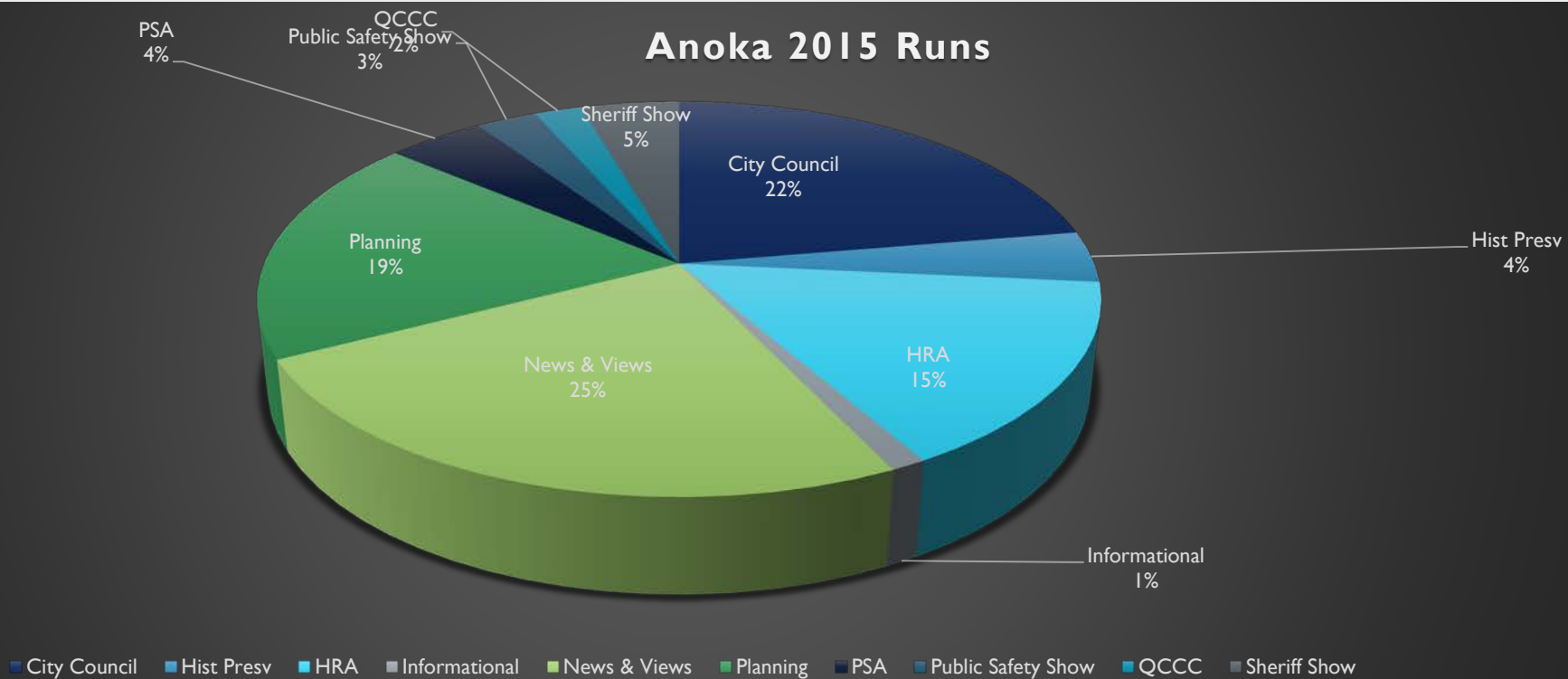
Andover 2015 Runs





2015 TOTAL RUNS FOR ANOKA MEETINGS

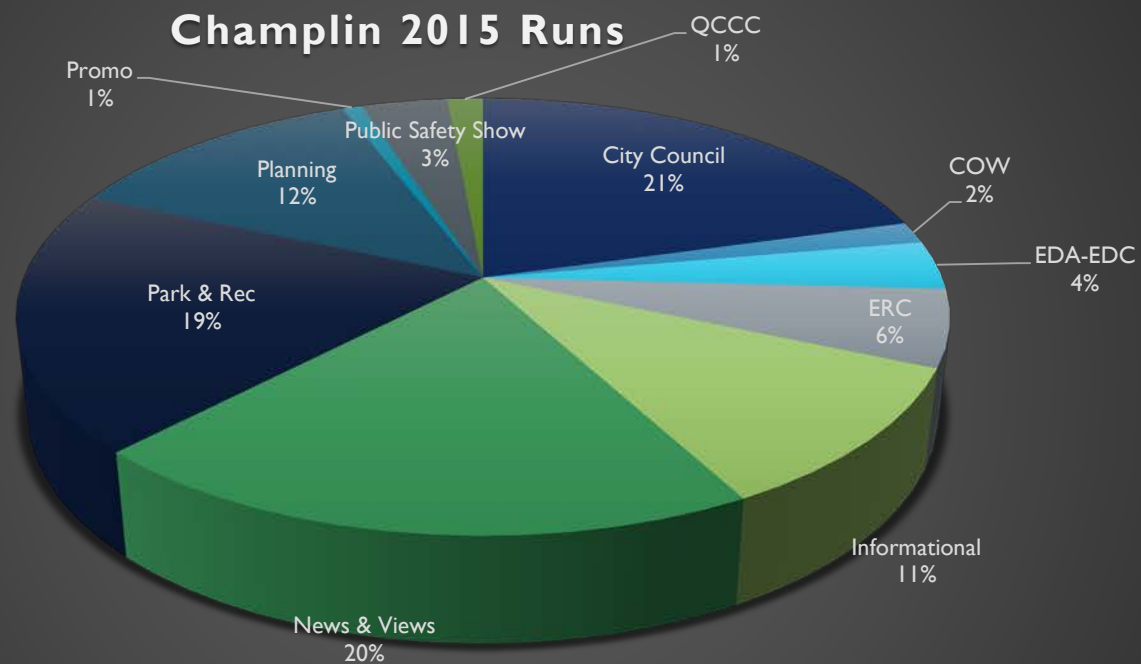
Anoka 2015 Runs

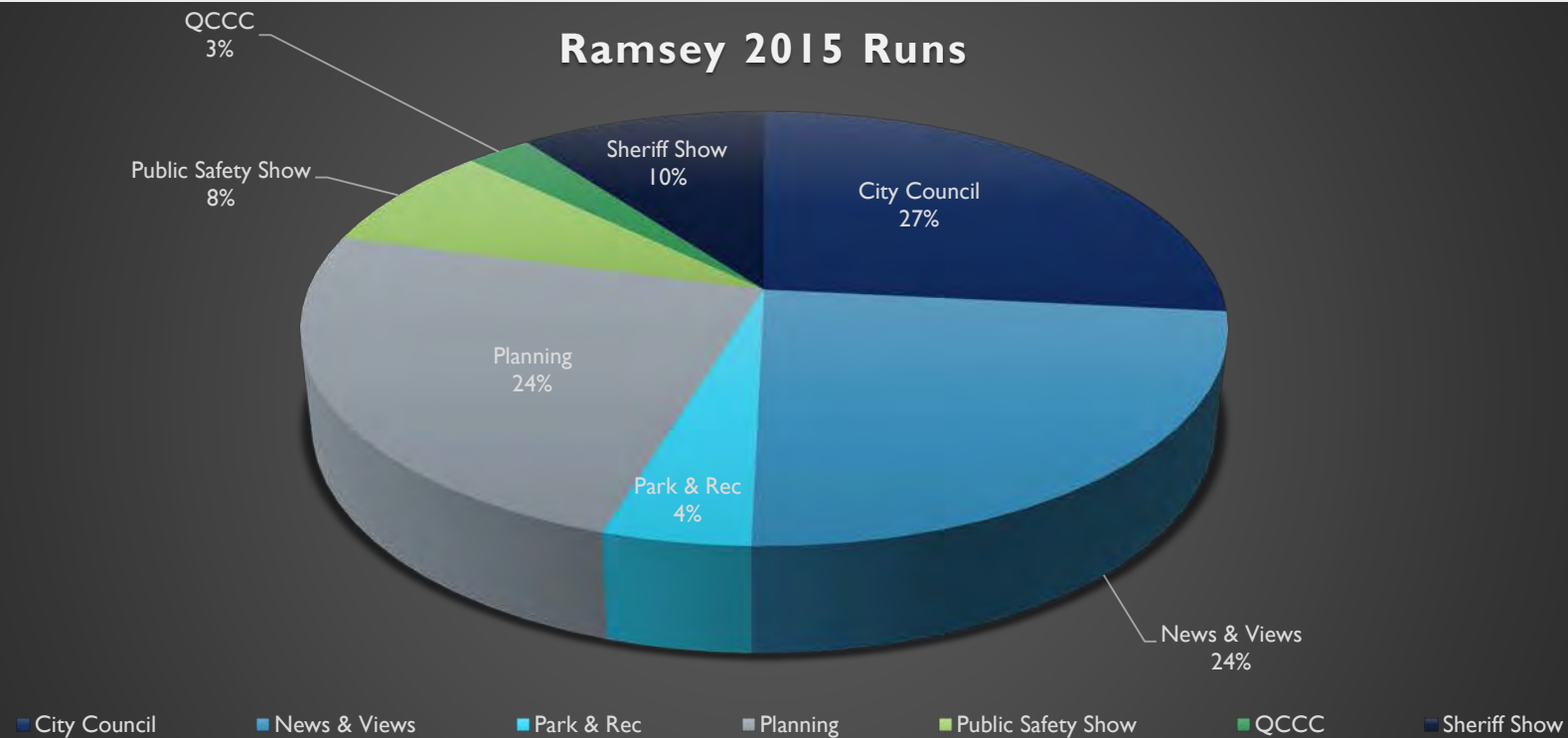

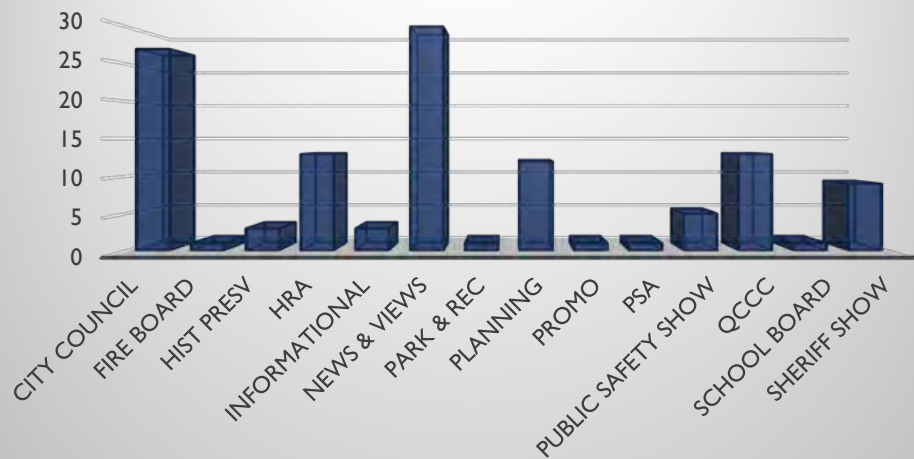
2015 NUMBER OF ANDOVER PROGRAMS AND AVERAGE LENGTH



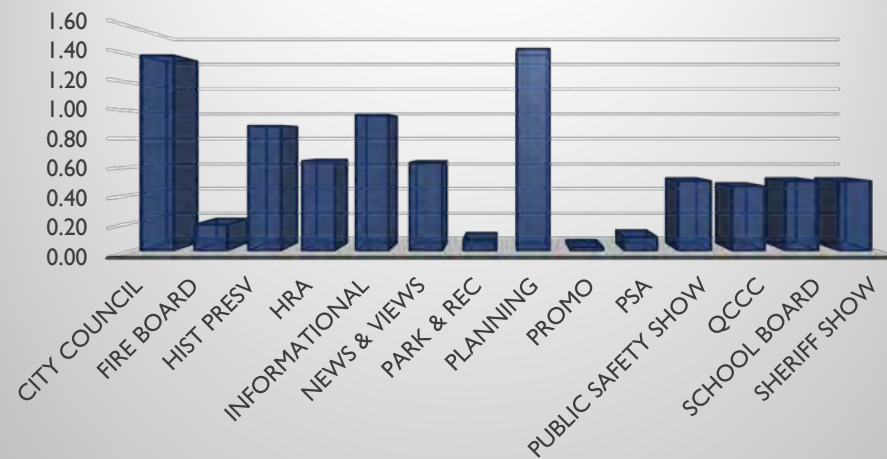


2015 NUMBER OF ANOKA PROGRAMS AND AVERAGE LENGTH

Number of Programs



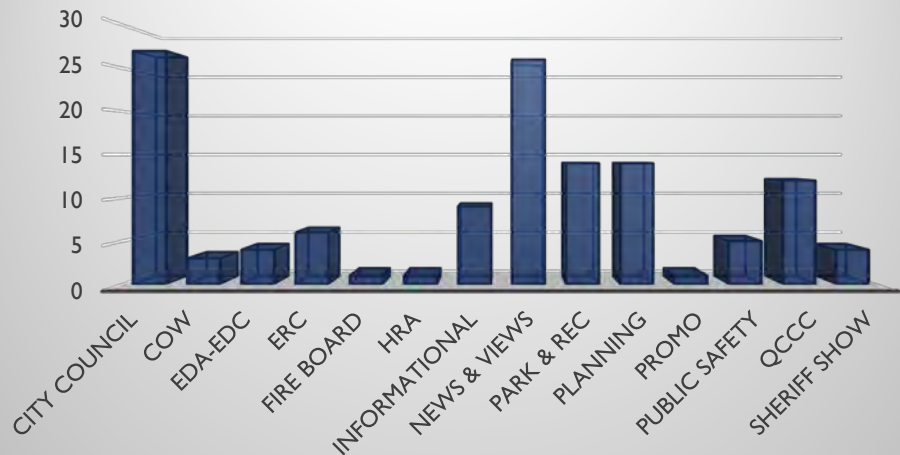

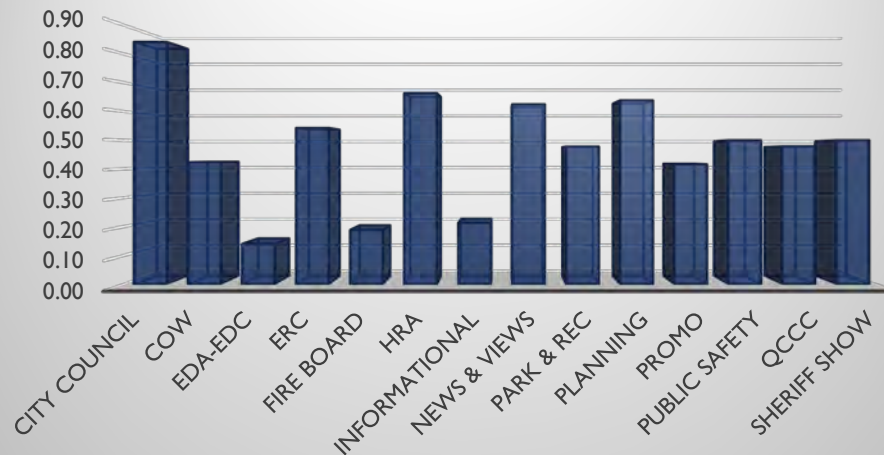


2015 NUMBER OF CHAMPLIN PROGRAMS AND AVERAGE LENGTH

Number of Programs

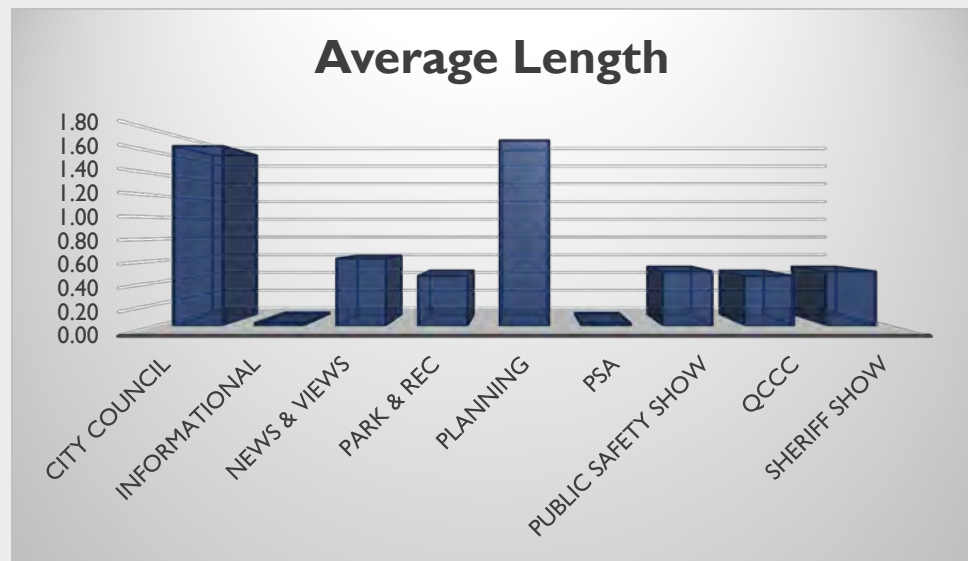
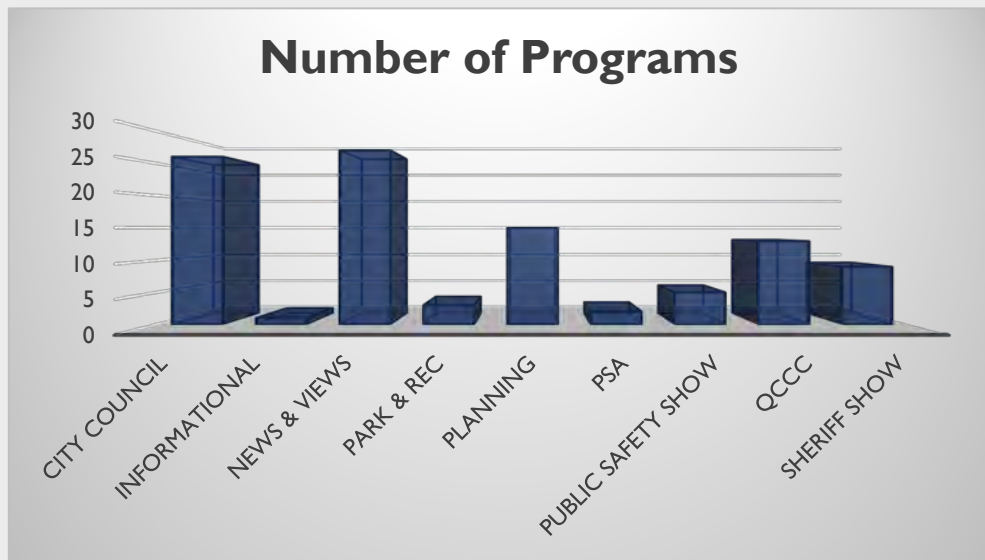

2015 NUMBER OF RAMSEY PROGRAMS AND AVERAGE LENGTH



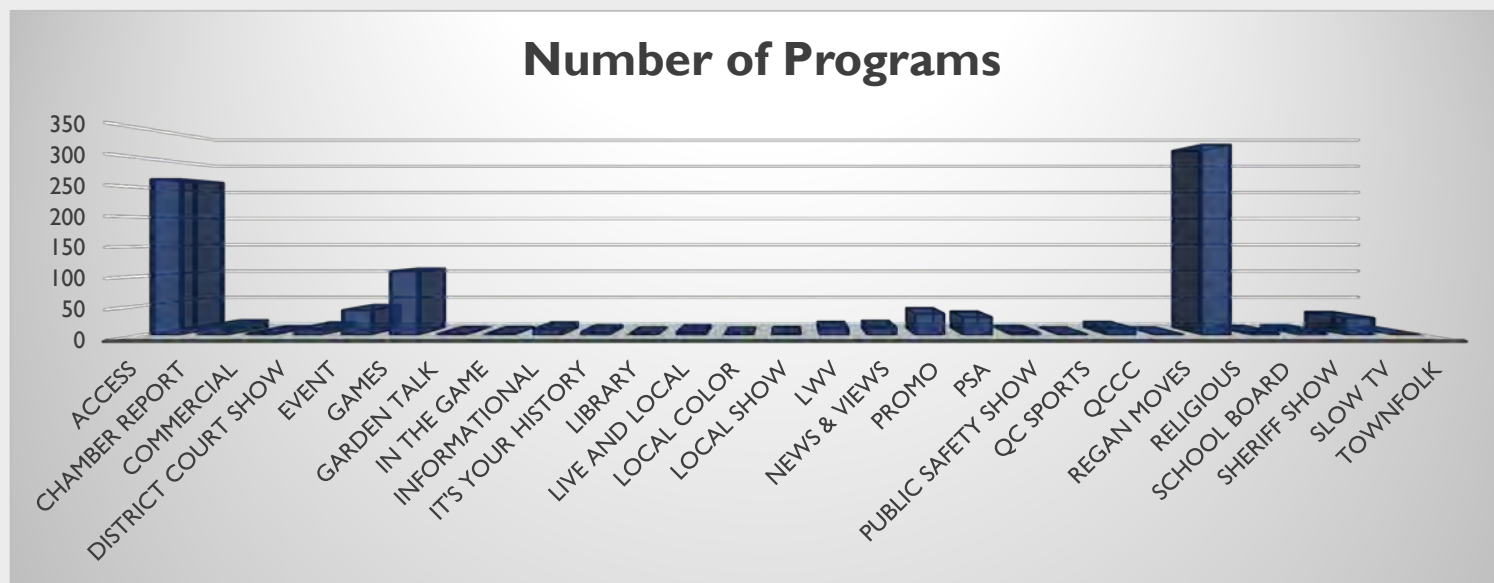

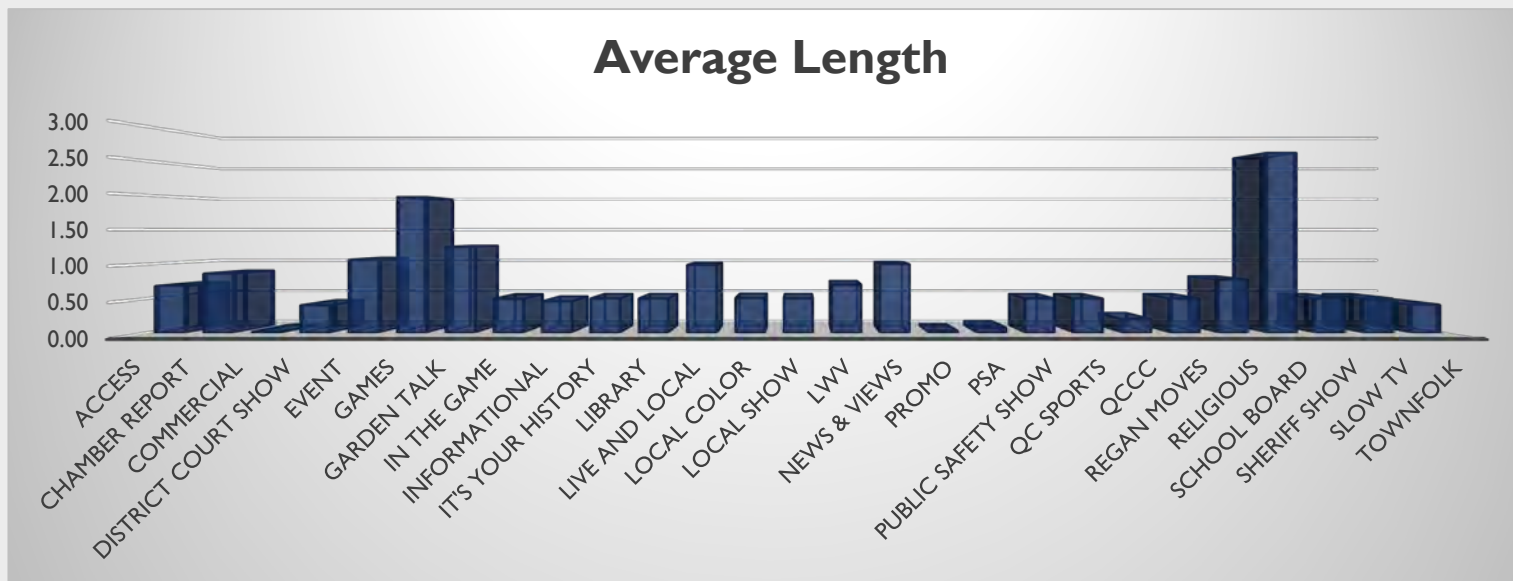


2015 NUMBER OF COMMUNITY CHANNEL PROGRAMS

Program Guidelines

General Guidelines:

QCTV reserves the right to air all content it produces and/or films on QCTV's channels and website.

QCTV makes all final decisions on air time, frequency of playback and priority of airing.

QCTV may use any portions of footage filmed for other unrelated broadcasts produced by QCTV.

All content produced by QCTV is copyrighted (see public use of QCTV copyrighted content).

Inappropriate content will not be produced or considered for playback.

Examples of inappropriate content include:

- Programming with a commercial intent, such as that promoting a specific business or service, unless incidentally mentioned as part of a program or in exchange for a sponsorship.
- Political campaigning outside of a QCTV- approved political debate or forum.
- Programming containing religious content, unless incidentally mentioned as part of a program or is a local public access program submitted for Sunday morning playback (See Local Church Services, Page 6).
- Pornography or offensive material.
- Programming containing obscene content or language.

Election Coverage:

QCTV does not sponsor candidate forums nor does the organization produce debates.

QCTV covers candidate forums for local candidates sponsored by a community partner such as, the League of Women Voters (LWV), Chamber of Commerce, or other like organizations.

Programming is played through Election Day.

Other:

QCCCC – Meets the 3rd Thursday of each month

City Meetings will be scheduled up until the next live meeting (up to and including the day of the meeting).

QCTV's practice is to have the meeting scheduled for playback and VOD 24 hours after the meeting. Usually it is the next business day.

City meetings that occur less frequently (monthly, bi-monthly, quarterly, or annually) will be scheduled for playback for 30 days unless otherwise communicated by the city clerk.

QCTV does not edit public meeting content.

QCTV archives meetings for one year and are available on our website.

Each member city has their own record retention policy and official record of the public meeting- not the video recording.

DVD copies or downloads of unedited meetings produced by QCTV are available for purchase. (2015 cost \$15.00)

City government content is chosen for production and broadcast based on the interest and value it may have to our member cities. All content is meant to promote the goal of making Andover, Anoka, Champlin, and Ramsey the premiere place for living, raising families, and doing business.

Priorities for Video Production:

1. Broadcast of city meetings.
2. Production and broadcast of regular city programs, including "News and Views", "The Sheriff's Show", and "Public Safety Talk".
3. Production and broadcast of city activities such as
 - State of the Cities
 - Pertinent community issues, events, forums and projects
 - Election coverage.
4. Production and broadcast of public service announcements.

Editing and Playback of Meetings and Programming

Meetings of the City Council and other City meetings will be rebroadcast on QCTV's government channels as well as streamed on the QCTV website. The playback schedule and duration for these meetings is set by QCTV.

Meetings are recorded and broadcast from gavel to gavel and will not be edited or modified for any reason, including typographical errors in graphics. Production of the meeting, including decisions about what camera angle or electronic presentation is shown during the broadcast, is dictated by the director of the meeting, who is a QCTV staff member.

Programming and content outside of city meetings, including regular programming and public service announcements and special events, is produced and edited by QCTV staff. Content is dictated by staff members and is ultimately subject to the approval by QCTV's Executive Director. The playback schedule and duration for this programming is set by staff with the approval of the Executive Director.

To ensure consistency, content from non-government agencies and organizations will not be accepted for playback on government channels but should be directed to QCTV's community channel.

Video content professionally produced by government units or organizations to which QCTV is affiliated with will be considered for playback on QCTV government channels. Video must be of a like-professional quality, with strong picture and audio quality, composition, lighting and white balance of content.

DVD copies or downloads of all meetings, events, and content produced by QCTV is available for purchase (2015 cost \$15.00).

Public Use of QCTV Copyrighted Content

Content produced by QCTV staff is available to the public for use when a written request is made for specific footage. QCTV may charge a fee to recoup the cost of preparing the requested media files. Credit must be given to "QCTV" for any content used. Failure to do so may result in legal action.

Public Access

Videos not eligible for playback on government channels might be appropriate for playback on QCTV's community channel.

Community Channel Scheduling

News and Views:

This program is produced monthly and features four fifteen minute segments from the cities of Andover, Anoka, Champlin, and Ramsey. Each city segment features two interviews from one city council member or mayor and one city department person. Each segment has a different QCTV host as well as two video packages that were filmed in the field. Typically we shoot the interviews on the last Thursday of the month in the QCTV studio and the show airs starting at the first of the month. Besides the hard schedule below, it is available on demand on our website.

Playback of the show is as follows:

Monday – Saturday: 12 pm & 7 pm

The Sheriff's Show: This show is produced every other month and features Anoka County Sheriff James Stuart and all that is happening in the sheriff's department.

Monday, Wednesday: 11 am & 8 pm

Friday: 10:30 am & 8 pm

The District Court Show: This monthly show is hosted by Judge Stephen Halsey and Judge Elizabeth Strand and focuses on the many facets of the judicial system.

Tuesday, Thursday: 10:30 am & 8 pm

Saturday: 11 am & 8 pm

It's Your History: This show is produced every other month in conjunction with the Anoka County Historical Society and focuses on the history of our community.

Monday, Wednesday, Saturday: 11:30 am & 8:30 pm

The Chamber Report: This monthly program is hosted by Anoka Area Chamber of Commerce staff and features local businesses in our area.

Tuesday, Thursday and Friday: 11:00 am & 8:30 pm

Local Sports: QCTV produces a wide array of local sports including basketball, football, lacrosse, baseball, and softball. During sports seasons, approximately two games per week are live games. After the live games, playback is at 4 pm and 9:30 pm the following day and then other times as well.

QCTV Community programming: Such as State of the City, League of Women Voters Programs, Anoka's Anti-Crime Breakfast, Antique Appraisal, Child Safety Awareness, community parades and graduations, etc. are played back for up to 30 days.

Local Church Services: Sunday morning through noon. QCTV requires a 30 or 60 minute show, there is a minimum of one play; if time allows additional playbacks of the service will be scheduled.

Access programming: Includes other local programming received off the Prisma, which is the connection for all Twin Cities access centers to share their programming. These include programs of interest to our coverage area like sports, community events, talk shows, etc.

Other sources of access programming include national, regional and locally submitted programming.

Channel 19 Bulletin Board Guidelines: QCTV posts free bulletin board listings of non-commercial events and activities for non-profit organizations in our four cities. QCTV reserves the right to limit the number of bulletins per month for any non-profit group.


